

Each year the District sets aside one afternoon to enable all students moving from elementary to middle school an opportunity to visit their new school. back. Unfortunately they can not manage to be with students if they visit a middle school other than our pathway schools. So, if your child is going to another middle school it will be up to parents to transport them to and from their middle school.



Student Led Conferences and a Celebration of Learning



Mark your calendars because on Tuesday, May 14th and Wednesday May 15th the children will be

dismissed at 11:52 on both days. Beginning at about 12:50 parents will be invited to come into the classrooms and walk through some of the work their children have done. The kids just love showing off what they have learned and what they know. So please mark your calendars and look for more information coming home soon. Each teacher will be setting up differently so please look for more details closer to the dates.

We will holding our lockdown drill at 11:00am on Wednesday, May 8th. A lockdown is a safety procedure designed to maximize the safety of staff and students in circumstances where there is a potential for violence in the school or surrounding area. During a lockdown, staff and students will secure themselves in their immediate area, lock and secure all interior doors when possible, turn off lights, and remain out of sight - in lockdown until released by police.

Constable Perry is helping with our drill this time and will be looking for areas where we can improve.

Teachers will review the procedures with students before we have the drill. We will mention it on the announcements. Children follow our earthquake procedures by ducking and covering as the teacher secures the room. Then as directed by their teacher, students can move to their lockdown area. They then simply remain quiet and wait for the 'All Clear' announcement.

This is just another type of drill we practice at school, like our fire and earthquake drill. We will let you know how we did and where we need to improve. Thanks to Constable Perry for all her expert help.

Student Placement Process 2019 - 2020

At the PAC meeting last week I explained to those present that this year we are not going to be taking class placement requests from parents as we have done in previous years.

As the class configuration was established it became evident that we would once again have a large number of combined classes, and needed the flexibility to place each child where we felt was the best learning environment for them.

Teachers know a great deal about the children they have been working with all year and they are in the best position to create learning groups for the next year.

Teachers meet with colleagues, deliberate over each placement, and then come back with revisions. I did a quick count of the number of hours they focus on student placement and came to realize that collectively, our teachers probably put in over 137 hours to ensure they are making the right decisions.

Teachers will continue to take into account aspects such as: classroom balance; each child's social, emotional, and behavioural needs; physical and social maturity; student learning needs- learning style; need for learning assistance or Inclusive Learning services, and many, other facets of class composition.

So this year if you have an educationally significant aspect that you feel we may not already know, please speak with your child's teacher, with me, or Mrs. Chretien.

We understand that any kind of change can be difficult, and this is a big change and will take time to get used to. But remember that you have some of the best teachers around making the best decisions for your child. You have trusted them all year, don't stop now.
