Please save your gently used books for our Book Binge

This is a great opportunity to encourage your child to keep reading over the summer break!

Gear up for new reading material by simply bringing in your child's gently used books (i.e. fiction, non-fiction, chapter books, picture books, comic books, etc. Pease note: board books and toddler books are too young for our students, but they can be donated to the 1000x5 book bin near the office). Students will be given one ticket for each book they bring in (up to 3 tickets per student). Any books brought in over that amount will be donated to the Book Binge. In June, your child's class will come to the library to cash in their tickets and shop for gently used books. The idea is that every student will receive at least one "new" book to keep.

Your child may drop books off to Madame Skinner at the library during regular class visits. Please clearly label any bags with your child's name and teacher/division to be sure they get credit for the books they bring in. A few important details for the Bike-to-School Ride:

- Safety First: All participants must wear helmets throughout the ride. We highly recommend wearing bright, reflective clothing to enhance visibility. Adhering to traffic rules and riding in a responsible manner is of utmost importance.
- Route and Chaperones: We will take the best routes to school (Appendix B: Best Routes to School Map p.48). All parents/guardians of participants are encouraged to be present throughout the ride to provide guidance and support.
- Bike Check: Prior to the event, make sure your bike is in good working condition. Check the brakes, tires, and ensure that the chain is properly lubricated.

All active modes of transport are welcome! Feel free to walk, scoot, skate or run alongside on the sidewalk.
